



When States Are Projected To Exhaust Federal CHIP Funding

The following table lists when states are expected to exhaust federal funding for their CHIP programs, if federal funding is not extended beyond federal fiscal year (FFY) 2015. According to current projections, all but one state would exhaust federal funding during FFY2016; notably, ten states would exhaust funds in the first quarter of FFY2016. This data was originally compiled and published by the Medicaid and CHIP Payment and Access Commission (MACPAC) in a March 10, 2015 [letter](#) to Congress regarding the extension of federal CHIP funding. MACPAC conducted its analysis using November 2014 data from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Given a number of variables, including changes in enrollment and fluctuations in CHIP spending, it can be challenging to predict when states will exhaust their federal CHIP funds. NASHP reached out to state CHIP Directors in March 2015 to request the most up-to-date projections. The table below reflects the updated information we received, which includes changes to four states' projections (MA, OR, WV, and WY). States continue to review their financials to anticipate when they may need to make changes to the program if federal funding is not extended. NASHP will continue to track this information and update this chart.
